






- 1 Mirwais Khan Hotak (1673-1715), Pashtun tribal leader who defeated the Persians to found territory including areas of modern southern Afghanistan and northern Pakistan.
- 2 Dr William Brydon (1811-73), a doctor in the British Army during the first Anglo-Afghan war. He was reportedly the only survivor of the column massacred by Afghan tribesmen on the retreat from Kabul in 1842.
- 3 Sir William Hay Macnaghten (1793–1841), British political agent murdered in Kabul.
- 4 Boris Gromov (1943-), Soviet commander and last Soviet soldier to leave Afghanistan in 1989. He went on to be prominent in Russian politics.
- 5 Ethnic groups in Afghanistan.
- 6 Ahmad Shah Durrani (1722-72), founder of the Durrani Empire and regarded to be the founder of the modern state of Afghanistan.
- 7 The Ghorid and Ghaznavid dynasties ruled territories covering areas of modern day Afghanistan, India, Iran and Pakistan from about the tenth to twelfth centuries.
- 8 Jamaluddin al-Afghani (1838-97), Muslim scholar and writer associated with the revivalist movement in Islamic thought.
