

Sensitive shoes



The 'Sensitive Shoes' offer "emotional wellbeing" to the wearer via reflexology and aromatherapy. Whilst walking, pressure points are stimulated by pressing on sensitive pads that correspond with various reflexology points, causing a gentle glow from the underside of the sole. The ball of the foot touches on the solar plexus point - the centre of emotional energy. The shoes offer an emotional 'bath of light' experience so that the act of walking is "healing". The light also creates novel olfactory experiences as subtle fragrance molecules are dispensed via the heel to heightened sensation.
