A new piece of grafitti appears on the tow path on the leafy south bank of the Thames near Oliver's Island. The large block capitals are neatly painted on the low wall which separates the lower pathway from the higher one, from which the steep bank slants down to the river. The grafitti includes the instruction "google 6 million lies".

After coming accross this on his daily walk, J (now aged 83 and living in London since the 1950's) returns with a bucket of soapy water and a scrubbing brush . With diffucly he managed to remove enough of the paint to make the writing illegible. Some weeks later the same message appears again on a bench further along the same stretch of river.
