Digital A deeply cinematic, psycho-dramatic experience that pushes at the ecstatic limits of narrative and impressionistic poetry, the eagerly-awaited Wayfaring Stranger sees Zimmerman explore rich, new, sensorial modes, with contributions from acclaimed writers Eileen Myles, Xiaolu Guo and sound-designer Chris Watson.

Nine strangers, comprising women and a non-binary person, move from the city to the edge across landscapes both radically altered and enduring in a search for meaning and their place in the larger ecology.

UK 2003. Directors Vision Machine Film Project. 70min. Digital Using subversive, hilarious, situationist-style interventions and piercing critique, *The Globalisation Tapes*, made by two Indonesian workers unions and the Vision Machine collective (which included Zimmerman and *The Act of Killing's* Joshua Oppenheimer), appeared as a radical outlier in independent film, exposing the devastating role of militarism and repression in building the 'global economy'. Don't miss this very rare screening.



Art Class + discussion with Andrea Luka Zimmerman and filmmaker Penny Woolcock

UK 2020. Director Andrea Luka Zimmerman. 49min. Digital Art and class – the two words hang in tension and determine who in the political hierarchy gets to make what, how their creativity is received and even raises the question of what 'art' is. Conceived as a lecture delivered to camera, with candid reflections from Zimmerman, this at once extremely playful, yet fiercely-critical essay film-fiction hybrid features contributions from other creative voices, delivering jolts of subversive energy.
