











Installation of *UK Diaspora* at the International Slavery Museum after the composite assemblage was acquired in 2017.










#### **SEMINAR 6: NOVEMBER 30**

Widening the Discourse / Deconstructing Race

For our final 'Black Thought' Seminar, we shall be widening the discourse to include a broader range of artistic and theoretical practice based on our collective research. Each of us will contribute to the discussion.

 Select one artwork which is either by an artist of black heritage, or which addresses questions related to black identity. The artist can be of your own choosing, or someone we have already discussed. But the artwork itself must be one that has NOT yet been discussed in the previous five seminars. Consider what you think is interesting or significant about the artwork and prepare a 2 minute talk about the work. (All students will give their talk).

The talk should include at least one quotation about the artist or the artwork. It should also include when and where the work was made/performed /exhibited, its materials and dimensions (including duration) and whether it is part of a collection.
