NOUVELLES DIRECTIONS DANS L'ÉTUDE DES TISSUS HISTORIQUES

L'étude des textiles et des vêtements s'est considérablement développée au cours des dernières décennies, embrassant des approches et des méthodes de recherche issues d'un large éventail de disciplines : l'anthropologie, l'archéologie, le pratique et les sciences de la conservation, et l'histoire des techniques et de la technologie, d'art, artisanat et design, de culture, économie et société. Les thèmes abordés ont été tout aussi vastes et approfondis, touchant à de multiples aspects de la production, de la diffusion et de la consommation des textiles, depuis la préparation des matières premières jusqu'à la fabrication et au recyclage des vêtements ou de l'ameublement. Ils ont donc examiné de nombreux aspects de l'expérience humaine et de nombreuses significations attachées à différents types d'objets. Cette conférence vise à contribuer davantage au partage et au développement de formes innovantes d'analyse relatives à des objets et traditions textiles familiers ou non, y compris l'intersection entre les tissus et l'habillement.

Le thème de la conférence, "Nouvelles orientations dans l'étude des textiles historiques", complètera l'exposition organisée au Museo del Traje (Musée du vêtement) de Madrid, qui accueillera la conférence, en réfléchissant à l'historiographie du vêtement et du textile, aux développements récents dans ce domaine et aux perspectives prometteuses. Madrid abrite des collections textiles qui révèlent l'héritage de l'Espagne, représentant diverses cultures et divers peuples.

NEW DIRECTIONS IN THE STUDY OF HISTORICAL TEXTILES

The study of textiles and dress has expanded considerably over the last few decades, embracing research approaches and methods from a range of disciplines: they include anthropology, archaeology, conservation practice and science and the histories of techniques and technology, of art, craft and design, of culture, economics and society. The themes broached have been similarly broad and probing, touching on multiple aspects of textile production, dissemination and consumption, from the preparation of raw materials to the making and recycling of garments or furnishings. They have accordingly examined many aspects of human experience and many meanings attached to different object types. This conference seeks to contribute further to sharing and developing innovative forms of analysis relative to familiar and unfamiliar textile objects and traditions, including the intersection between textiles and dress.

The theme of the conference, "New Directions in the Study of Historical Textiles", will complement the exhibition being held at the Museo del Traje (Dress Museum) in Madrid, which will host the conference, reflecting on the historiography of dress and textiles, recent developments in the field, and promising futures. Madrid is home to textile collections that reveal Spain's heritage representing diverse cultures and peoples.
