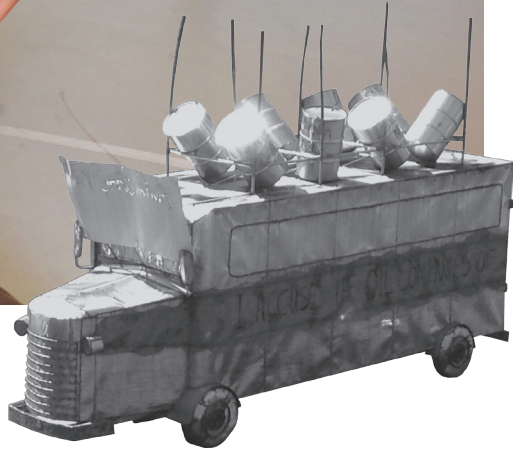


Doing Nothing is Not an Option

Doing Nothing is Not an Option is a performance piece that will start at 12 noon on Saturday 27th June in Peckham Square, Peckham, London SE15.

It has been created to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the execution of Nigerian writer Ken Saro-Wiwa and other activists in November 1995 who campaigned against Shell's exploitation and destruction of the Ogoni people's land in the Niger Delta, Nigeria by drilling for oil.

Doing Nothing is Not an Option uses The Bus, a sculpture made by British-Nigerian artist, Sokari Douglas Camp and has been created by children and young people from Theatre Peckham



in collaboration with writer/artist Michael McMillan.

This event is a partnership between environmental campaigning organisation Platform London who commissioned The Bus sculpture; youth community theatre project Theatre Peckham; and arts commissioning organisation: Peckham Platform. The project will culminate in an installation curated by Michael McMillan at Peckham Platform from September – November 2015.
